My fascination with photography goes back almost as far in my life as does my history with cactus and succulents. We are talking mid to late 60's here and photography was for the most part thought of as a hobby activity. At any rate, I started college listing pre-engineering as my major and because I thought they offered better courses, switched from SWOS to OSU at OKC. I will not go into the gory details, it would take too long. Let's just say Vietnam and Uncle Sam came and 'touched me'. Two years later I had survived Vietnam and decided to use part of my VA loan money for a Photography Trade School, which is where I honed my skills with a camera as well as developing a huge love for the dark room. Growing up most of the photography I did was Polaroids of family events. After Shela & I got married, I started visiting her brother-in-law, Lynn. He was fairly advanced in his photographic skills and for years we played a game of "Keeping up with the Jones", seeing who can get the latest or handiest gadget. I remember one night he and I spent a couple of hours on the S. 19th St. bridge over Interstate 35; no lights as far as the eye could see. We tried about every variation of traffic pattern shots we could imagine. That area now hosts close to 100 businesses. I became more involved in Sports Photography; one year shooting 450+ teams in addition to working full time. That became too hard on my health, working late hours every night so I gave up that business. I now enjoy taking nature and landscape pictures and am getting more enthused with what can be done with a digital camera and computer software. With this luxury I can shoot a bit wider angle and get the best proportion and framework for each shot. I have started journaling my gardens now, taking before and after shots of potting plants and documenting plants in bloom. This helps my design with a photographers framework in mind. P.S. Off the subject: I have been growing a yucca carnerosana in my back yard for several years; it is now producing a mammoth bloom stalk. I hope to catch it's growth habit in full. **Fred Hill**

Individuals wanting to sell garden related items can reserve booths as space allows at the rate of \$30 for a 10x10 & 1 free table or \$55 for a 10x20 & 1 free table. Tax permit # is required. 2013 Show & Sale - We have been informed by Louis with the Garden Center that we can not schedule any event more than 12 months ahead. For example, we cannot reserve a Show date for 2013 any sooner than around the middle of May this year if we want the first weekend of June, 2013. Since we have no choice, we will pick a weekend for 2013 making sure to call 2 weeks before the desired date for next year. Our first choice is June 1-2, 2013 and our 2nd choice is June 8-9, 2013. The CSSA Convention is in Austin June 15-20, 2013 and several of our members are hoping to attend since it is fairly close distance-wise. The weekend before June 1-2, 2013 is Memorial Day weekend which would probably not be ideal.

Annual Show & Sale

The Volunteer Information/Sign Up Form given to each member every year will be available at the April meeting. This details the dates, times and activities of the Show and Sale, lists the various jobs that need to be covered during the event and things that need to be done to get ready for the event. There is a lot that needs to be done, especially the last few weeks, and then at the Show itself.

Joyce provided a copy of the Vendor Contract which is mailed to potential vendors and we looked this over for any errors, corrections or deletions. This form will also be used for club members wishing to sell items, with rewording and/or omission of several items as indicated. A copy of the 2012 Plant Sale Rules was also presented for review. Any member wishing to sell any items at the Show and Sale should contact either Joyce or Niki by June 1st. (Floor arrangements and table space have to be allocated beforehand.)

Joyce is working on getting vendors lined up and she will let us know who they will be when she has all the paperwork signed and returned to her. This also applies to the Judges.

Planning for the Show and Sale has started and few things decided upon have been the continuation of the People's Choice balloting and awards, the drawings, and use of the TV for Desert Speaks DVDs. Fred Hill has mailed a good portion of his pre-show advertising and contacting others by email. The postcards are done and some will be used as advertising and others mailed. We have included the following statement on the cards *"Bring your postcard to the reception desk, get it stamped, and get \$1 off your total purchase."* This will enable the workers at the reception desk to check off a list the person who is presenting the card (or add them if needed) and check their mailing information. They will not need to sign the 'sign in' sheet and this might encourage other visitors nearby to be sure to 'sign in' to receive a postcard next year and the \$1 off.

SUCCULENT PLANTS

Leaf succulent- Peperomias



Peperomia is one of the two large genera of the Piperaceae family, with more than 1000 recorded species. Most of them are compact, small (usually do not exceed 12 inches (30 cm) in height) perennial epiphytes growing on rotten wood. More than 1500 species have been recorded, occurring in all tropical and subtropical regions of the world, though concentrated to Central America and northern South America. A limited number of species (around 17) are found in Africa.

Though varying considerably in appearance these species generally have thick, stout stems and fleshy leaves, sometimes with leaf windows. *Peperomia* flowers typically come in yellow to brown conical spikes. Research indicates that *Peperomia* species contain poisonous elements associated with alkaloid leaves and stems.

Growth habits range from upright forms that tend to be shrubby when young and sprawl with age to rosette forms and prostrate vines, all with tolerance to relatively low light levels.

These tropical perennials are grown for their ornamental foliage. Some have threadlike, trailing stems and some have fleshy, stout stems. The leaves may be green or striped, marbled or bordered with pale green, red or gray, and the petioles of some kinds are red. The tiny flowers are not obvious and they grow in the form of cordlike spikes.

Horticulture

Currently, there are over 100 species of *Peperomia* cultivated in the United States, although many are with collectors. Many interesting forms which are occasionally seen in commerce have not been properly named due to lack of taxonomic research on the genus. The most widely produced species is *Peperomia obtusifolia* (oval-leaf peperomia) and its cultivars. From:

Growing Conditions:

Light: Peperomia do well in low to moderate light, such as found in a northern or east-facing window. They can be easily grown under fluorescent lights.

Water: Keep the soil moist during the growing season and provide relatively high humidity through spraying or by setting the pot in a gravel tray.

Temperature: Average. Peperomia do well in the relatively cool environment of most homes (although they dislike the dry). Aim for 65°F to 75°F.

Soil: A loose, well-drained, very rich potting mix.

Fertilizer: Fertilize biweekly during the growing season with a diluted liquid fertilizer or use controlled-release fertilizer pellets at the beginning of the growing season. (about.com houseplants)

Propagation

These plants are usually propagated by seeds. They are also commercially propagated by cuttings. *Peperomia* cuttings root easily.

Plants can be divided at potting time. They are removed and separated into smaller pieces, each with a few roots attached. Leaf or stem cuttings can also be taken in the spring or summer. The lower leaves of the shoots are removed and a cut is made below the bottom node (joint). They are then laid on a bench for an hour or two to allow a protective corky skin to form over the cuts. They are then inserted in a propagating case with bottom heat of 70-75 degrees F. It is best not to seal the top completely, as the plants are semi-succulent in nature and excessive humidity is detrimental. When enough roots have formed, cuttings can be planted in 3-inch pots or in hanging baskets. (Wikipedia)

THE CULTIVATION CORNER

J & J Cactus and Succulents Soil Mix



My base is Metro-Mix 366.

My coarse materials are:

Pumice - <http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Pumice> - I buy it in bags when I go out to Tucson. From Toro Brand, Triple A Fertilizer Co. – Cell Phone 520-574-0040 – Must pre-order bagged pumice.

Perlite - <http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Perlite> - I buy it in bags from American Plant Products a wholesale greenhouse supplier in Oklahoma City. 405-787-4833

Haydite – <http://www.haydite.com/> - High Fired Baked Clay – I buy in bulk from Chandler Material, Co., Tulsa, OK. 918-836-9151

Osmocote 13-13-13, time-release fertilizer – I buy it in a 50-pound bag from American Plant Products a wholesale greenhouse supplier in Oklahoma City. 408-787-4833
This is what I use if I don't have the three stars list above.

Terface – Baked Clay used on Baseball Fields – I buy it in bags from American Plant Products a wholesale greenhouse supplier in Oklahoma City. 408-787-4833

Pea Gravel – I buy it in bags at Lowe's or Home Depot.

Crushed Granite – Found at Landscape supplies – Sometime found at feed stores to feed to poultry. I mix my soil in a 35-gallon trashcan or a wheelbarrow. I fill a five-gallon bucket with Metro-Mix 366. I then fill a five gallon bucket with pumice, perlite, and haydite the three stars. Then I mix the Metro and the other three ingredients together. I also add Osmocote 13-13-13, a time-release fertilizer. Mix well and away we go!

If I'm planting cacti, sometimes I add more coarse material.
Remember everyone's growing conditions are not the same, so you need to find out what type of soil mix works for you!

In the next pages I illustrate some of these shapes.

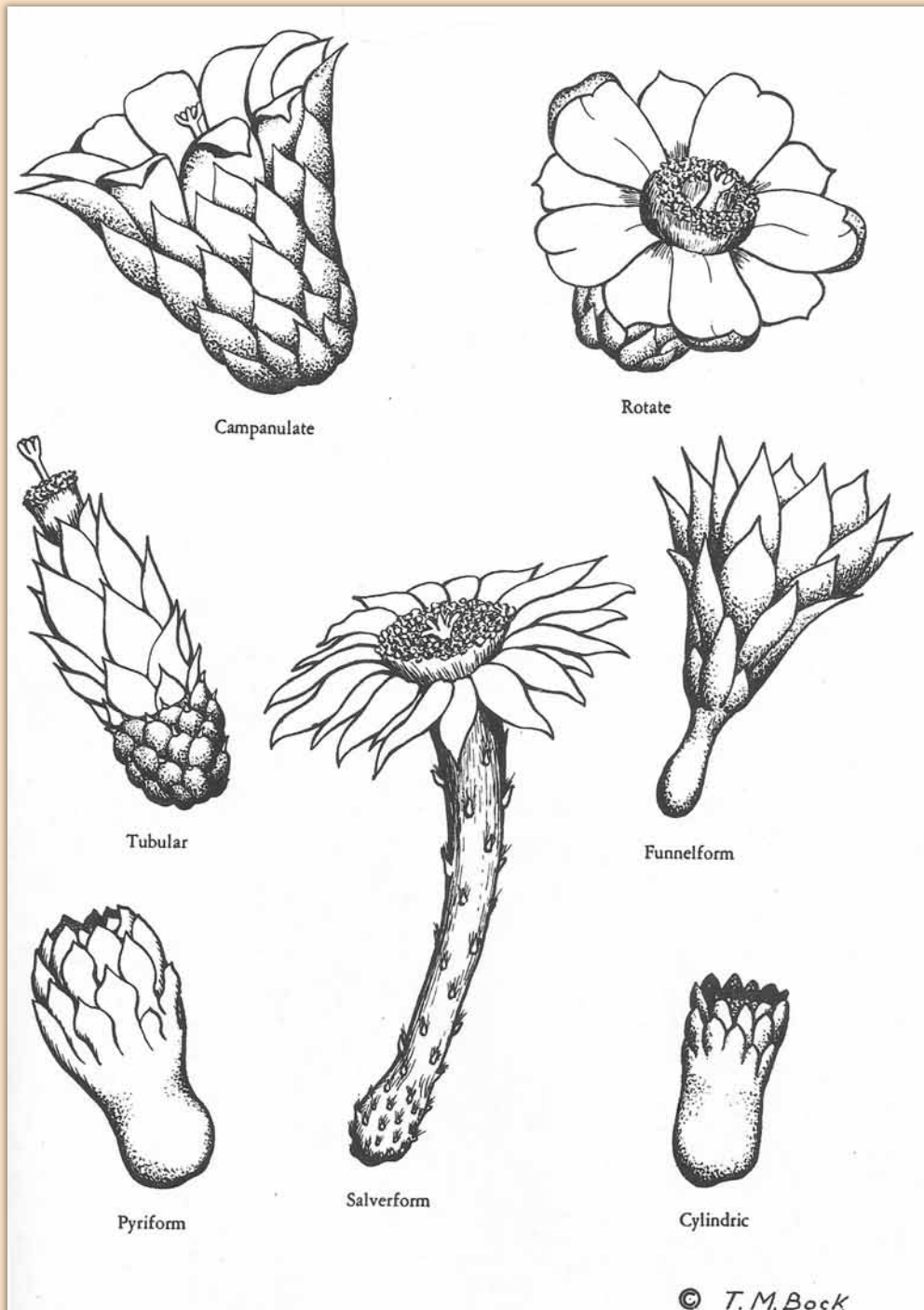
