President's message



Minutes of last meeting

Minutes of January 16, 2018

Meeting called to order by Rosario at 6:59pm with 16 members and 2 visitors present.

Raffle tickets for plant drawing were distributed. Rosario reminded attendees that yearly membership fees are due January 1st. Mark gave a treasurer's report that the club bank balance is \$8905.44; this amount does not include membership dues paid at the meeting. The club has signed a 3-year agreement with WRGC, and all room reservations have been made at WRGC for 2018. WRGC has issued rules regarding club members working at the garden center; any member who goes to WRGC to do any work should sign in at the office upon arrival and upon departure; the club is able to deduct documented "work time" from the cost of the room rentals. Robert will have sign-up sheets at the February meeting for the various positions/duties that need to be filled. Rosario informed attendees that the COCSS Board Meeting is scheduled for 1-21-18 @11am at the Myriad Gardens. Matt was introduced at the new club Librarian. Christmas Party options (day of the week, location, etc.) was discussed, and Rosario asked members to let her know if they would prefer to have the Christmas Party on a Thursday or a Saturday; the board will discuss this further at the board meeting. Rosario officially resigned as the COCSS Vice-President.

Mike presented the candidates for election/re-election. No other nominees were put forth. Ballots were handed out to attendees.



Carmen Rosa Avendaño from the Peruvian Cactus and Succulent Society shared with us this picture of her beautiful *Epiphyllum phyllanthus*. The flowers were open today by 6 am and she expected them to be closed by 9 am. *Epiphyllum phyllanthus* is a cactus that is pollinated by Hawk moths and it normally only opens at night. According to Carmen today was a cloudy day which allowed her to witness this beautiful event.

This cactus, known as "the climbing cactus" grows from Colombia in the north to Argentina in the south. *Epiphyllum phyllanthus* is an epiphytic cactus (grows on trees) found in a variety of habitats.

Article of the month *by Rosario Douglas*

A visit to Lomas de Ancon near Lima-Peru

Member Michael Douglas posted some information and pictures from a recent trip to a Peruvian national reserve north of Lima with a small group of Peruvian cactus aficionados (members of SPECS (the Peruvian Cactus & Succulent Society based in Lima) and several Reserve rangers.

The goal was to see the unique fog-dependent ecosystem that included three bromeliads (genus *Tillandsia*) and some cactus species, as well as some other inhabitants of the zone.

Some of the plants that were photographed during the visit - to an area so dry that it basically does not rain, included cacti such as *Haageocereus pseudomelanostele*, *Neoraimondia arequipensis*, *Loxanthocereus acanthurus* and *Mila caespitosa* (only found in Peru).

A visit to Lomas de Ancon near Lima-Peru cont.

This ecosystem is almost entirely based on fog-water derived from low clouds that impinge upon the hills. On fog-saturated hills (more frequent cloudiness) there is another type of vegetation present - mostly herbaceous with very few cacti or bromeliads. Only in this intermediate zone of partially cloudy days are the bromeliads abundant (not wet enough for them to rot?). The bromeliads show an interesting banding pattern, where they slowly grow downslope - the bands are apparently associated with fog droplets coming upslope and hitting the "leading" edge of the band - providing more moisture for growth on this, the upwind side of the band.

The Genus Mila

The genus Mila is an anagram for Lima, the capital of Peru. These clump-forming cacti are quite variable and this led to the belief that there were many species. Just to give you an idea here are some of the species that have been attached to this genus: *M. kubeana*, *M. nealeana*, *M. alboareolata*, *M. albisaetacens*, *M. breviseta*, *M. cereoides*, *M. densiseta*, *M. fortalezensis*, *M. lurinensis*, *M. pugionifera*, *M. sublanata*, and *M. colorea*.

More recently, authors have began to treat this as monotypic genus, meaning that most authors now recognize only one species (*Mila caespitosa*). This cactus is not common in cultivation.


