

## 2018 Novice Exhibitor

**Novice Exhibitor:** Any person that's a first year member and/or non-greenhouse grower. Rules of standard variety show are used in judging. Plants of the same species or variety within a species will be judged against the standard for comparable plants. There can be any number of first, seconds, and third place ribbon's awarded for plants in the same species/varieties. They will not be judged against one another, but on their own merit. Novice entry forms will be printed on light green paper.

**A Novice Best of Class Award** -will be presented to the best entry in any class in which there are three or more entries. This award will be a rosette ribbon.

**A Best Novice Cactus and Best Novice Succulent** -awards will be presented to entries in Novice Cactus and Novice Succulent provided they have won a blue ribbon in their class.

**Judges Award** - will be awarded by individual judges to their favorite cactus, succulent, or other entries in the show regardless of other awards earned by the entry. Judges may choose from the Advanced, Novice or Displays.

**People's Choice Award for Cactus and Succulent** -will be given to the cactus and succulent with the most votes cast by the public. The public may choose from the Advanced, Novice or Displays entries.

### 2018 Novice Cacti – Division I

Class 1. Mammillaria - A. in pots 6 inches or less diameter - B. in pots over 6 inches in diameter

Class 2. Coryphanta (including Epithelantha, Escobaria and Neobesseya)

Class 3. Notocactus (including Parodia)

Class 4. Gymnocalycium

Class 5. Ariocarpus

Class 6. Astrophytum

Class 7. Echinocereus

Class 8. Ferocactus (including Echinocactus)

Class 9. Rebutia (including Sulcorebutia)

Class 10. Lobivia (including Echinopsis)

Class 11. Turbinicarpus

Class 12. Cereus (including other cereus growing types)

Class 13. Opuntia (including Maihuenia and Tephrocactus)

Class 14. All other genus of Cacti

Class 15. Cristate, monstrose and variegated cacti on their own roots

Class 16. Grafted Cacti

Class 17. Collection of Cacti (five plants of the same genus but different species)

Class 18. Collection of Native Oklahoma Cacti (4 plants mixed or of same genus, but different species)

Class 19. Dish Gardens (cacti dominating)

Class 20. Cacti in hanging containers (one species per container)

Class 21. Creative Containers Cacti (one plant of any genus, species, or variety grown in unusual containers)

### 2018 Novice Succulents Other Than Cactus - Division II

Class 31. Aizoaceae (including but not limited to Lithops, Conophytum, Faucaria, Pleispilos and Trichodiadema)

Class 32. Asclepiadaceae (including but not limited to Caralluma, Hoya, Hurenia and Stapelia)

Class 33. Aloaceae (Haworthia only)

Class 34. Aloaceae (including but not limited to Aloe, Gasteria, Astroloba, and except Haworthia)

Class 35. Crassulaceae (including but not limited to Aeonium, Crassula, Echeveria and Kalanchoe)

Class 36. Agaveceae (including but not limited to Agave and Yucca)

Class 37. Dracaenaceae (including but not limited to Sansevieria)

Class 38. Apocynaceae (Pachypodium only)

Class 39. Apocynaceae (Adenium only)

Class 40. *milii type* – beharensis, delphinensis, duranii, horombensis, milii, etc.

Class 41. *stem type* – lophogona, viguieri, leucoeura, perrieri, stenoclada, pachypodioides, etc.

Class 42. *thickened root or caudex type* – decaryi, capsaintemariensis, francoisii, cylindrifolia, etc.

Class 43. *medusa-head type* – caput-medusa, gorgons, deception, esculent, pugniformis, flanaganii, etc.

Class 44. *caudiciform type* – stellate, micrantha, tortirama, squarrosa, knuthii, groenwaldii, tuberosa, etc.

Class 45. *stem type* (solitary or clustering) polygona, fasciculate, obesa, suzanneae, mammillaris, abdelkuri, columnaris, stellaespina, etc.

Class 46. *shrub type* – cooperii, cactus, grandicornis, pseudocactus, poissinii, weberbaueri, etc.

Class 47. Other Genera of Euphorbiaceae (including but not limited to Monadenium, Synadenium, Pedilanthus, Jatropha)

Class 48. Caudiciforms and pachycauls (plants not listed in other classes, including but not limited to Bursera, Operculicarya, Pachycormus, Ficus, Pseudobombax, Commiphora)

Class 49. All other genera of succulents not listed in other classes

Class 50. Cristate, monstrose, variegated and grafted

Class 51. Bonsai (plants grown and staged as bonsai succulents)

Class 52. Collections of Succulents (five plants of the same genus, but differing species or varieties)

Class 53. Dish gardens (succulent dominated)

Class 54. Succulents in hanging containers (one species per container)

Class 55. Creative containers (plants grown in unusual containers, one plant per container)

## 2018 Novice and Advanced Displays – Division III

Rules of standard variety shows are used in judging. There can be any number of first, second, and third place ribbons awarded for displays. They will not be judged against one another, but on their own merit. Each display will need an entry form. A green form for the Novice and a white form for the Advanced.

Provided there are one or more entries, in the Novice and Advanced Display class there will be the **Cactus and Succulent Society of America Education Trophy** to the best display in either Novice or Advanced.

Displays may contest of or a combination of:

- Cactus and/or Succulent Plants
- Cactus and/or Succulent Photography
- Cactus and/or Succulent Art
- Cactus and/or Succulent Handicrafts
- Cactus and/or Succulent -Novelties, and two-or three dimensional art
- Cactus and/or Succulent -Creative containers, novelties, art, etc.

Subject matter must be cactus and succulent related. You may enter up to 4 displays. You must request to the show manager what size tables and how many you will need. (6' or 8' tables)
