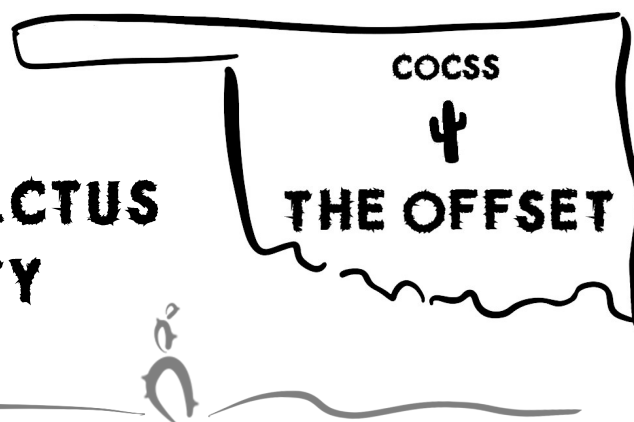

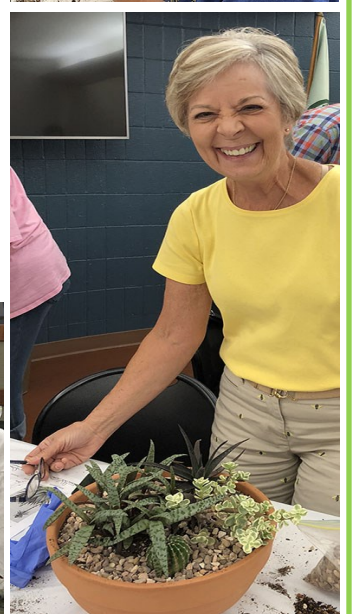
Editor's Message

Summer Cactus Gifts - Stephen G Sisco

Early this summer these two cacti decided they were mature enough to bloom, both on the same night. *Echinopsis calochlora* K. Schumann, white flower, fruit matured first and gave seed, and, *Echinopsis eyriesii* (Turpin) Pfeiff. & Otto, with a pink flower, fruited, matured second and gave seed. These were still in bloom the next morning. So me and my trusty pollen brush did some work and pollen was crossed. At least some seed will be hybrid. Most likely this will yield nothing particularly new. Regardless, as each fruit matured and split open I sowed the seeds. The fruit matured about two weeks apart, germinations were also about two weeks apart. I now have many cacti babies.
