This month's meeting I'm particularly excited about. Members Michael & Rosario Douglas have two different greenhouses on their property and this month Mike is going to be giving us the details.

"Greenhouses are an essential requirement to grow plants outdoors during the winter in Oklahoma. This talk describes an array of greenhouses available to individuals (non-commercial growers) and discusses strategies to grow plants within them. We discuss how to orient greenhouses, how to heat and cool them, how to water them, and planning for growth of your plants. Many examples will be shown of greenhouses, and we will candidly discuss problems we have experienced over the years. However, we strongly encourage people to explore personal greenhouses – they can be Immensely satisfying. "
